## A word from the head.....

**The Christmas preparations are already starting to take hold at the school. I can hear daily bursts of Christmas songs and the turkey, crackers and entertainment are booked for Christmas Lunch.**

Today you will have received your letters about the Christmas Lunch. Please complete the reply slip and make your payment via Parent Pay in the usual way. It is important that you return your slip even if your child is having their own packed lunch on the day.

Next Thursday, 29th November, is a mufti day and we are asking the children to exchange their school uniforms for their own clothes. In return we are asking for donations of bottles and chocolates for the FrOGS Christmas Tombola. The same day is also the School Disco. KS1 Children must be accompanied by an adult and the DISCO starts at 6pm. The KS2 Disco starts at 7.15pm. Please be reminded that the school is closed to pupils on 30th November for a staff INSET day.

The FrOGS Christmas Fair is on 8th December between 2pm and 4pm.

Could I please ask any parents who are entering the car park prior to the end of the school day and waving over the fence at the children in the KS1 playground to refrain from doing so. Thank you.

We are experiencing lots of late arrivals in the morning. It is really important that all children arrive for the start of the school day at 8.55 at the latest.

- If your child is 5 minutes late to school every day they will miss 3 days of learning a year.
- If they are 15 minutes late to school every day they will miss 2 weeks of learning.

This week the children had their photographs taken and we are expecting the proofs back into school next week. The turn around is going to be tight for any Christmas orders so please look out for the proofs and make your orders as soon as possible.

### Flu Immunisation

Parents of children in Reception through to Y5 will receive a flu vaccination in school on December 12th. You need to give your consent for your child to receive the nasal spray vaccination, this can be completed online at <https://www.glos-care.nhs.uk/consent-forms>. Your child can not be given the vaccination unless you have given consent.

### Battery Recycling

We now have a battery recycling point at the school. You are welcome to bring your old batteries to school to be recycled. You will find the battery recycling point in the entrance hall opposite the office.

## Attendance

Regular attendance at school is obviously very important to ensure that children get the most out of the learning opportunities available to them. There is a very strong link between attendance and achievement and together we must seek to ensure that all children achieve to the best of their abilities.

### Appointments

Please try to make appointments for after the school day. Missing parts of a day is disruptive to the child leaving the classroom and for the children within it. We do appreciate that some appointments for specialists and consultants are very difficult to have any control over, and accept that it may be unavoidable to have to take time during the school day.

### Term Time Holidays

Leave of absence for term time holiday can no longer be authorised by schools. Therefore, if a parent takes a child out of school for a holiday in term time it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. This could in turn lead to a warning and ultimately a fine. Please try to take all holidays during the set school holiday periods.

### Arriving Late?

Pupils arriving after 8.55am will be marked in the register as being late. Pupils arriving after 9.25am without any prior notification will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

### Persistent Absenteeism

Since September 2015 the persistent absence threshold has been 10%. This means that a child missing 38 sessions in a school year will be deemed as being persistently absent. 38 sessions equates to only 19 school days per year. Therefore any family taking 10 days unauthorised absence will be close to reaching the threshold for the school to report persistent absenteeism to the Local Authority. Authorised absences for illness, medical appointments, exclusions and other authorised absences are also considered in the context of persistent absenteeism. Therefore it is clear to see that 10 days unauthorised holiday and 9 days illness in a year would mean that your child would be deemed to have reached the persistent absenteeism threshold.

#### Some facts to think about

One half day's absence a week results in a pupil attaining only **90%** attendance.

If this absence continues, the pupil will have missed the equivalent of **four whole weeks of lessons in the school year.**

Over five years this absence will total **half a school year.**

**There is a clear link between attendance and achievement !**
