The children all appear to be well rested and have settled quickly back into the routines for school.

You should have now received a topic overview and letter from your child's teacher sharing with you the topic for the term and asking for your support with homework, reading, spelling and tables. Your support in helping your child with these tasks is greatly appreciated and does make a difference to the amount of progress that the children make.

After February half term we will be holding Parent/Teacher meetings where you will have the opportunity to discuss your child's progress. I have spent some time this week showing prospective parents around the school for the reception intake in September 2017. I felt very proud of our school as I showed the parents around. I saw astronauts in a space station, children writing about a talking mouse called Stuart, children learning about evolution and fossils and a group of children heading out of school to take part in an indoor athletics competition. In addition to this, the schools reputation with regards to Maths Mastery continues to grow with further schools from Gloucestershire, Oxfordshire, Worcestershire coming to observe the good practice taking place in the school. 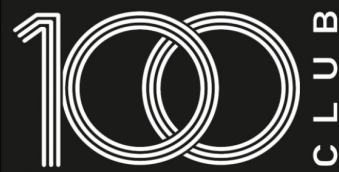

Apply online for

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Check to see if your child is eligible using the confidential online portal available on our website www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals

You can secure a tasty free meal for your child and save yourself up to £437 per year.

Plus your child's school receives extra funding for each eligible child registered.



If you receive a qualifying benefit, your child's school is entitled to extra funding.

So even if you don't want your child to take a free meal, you should still apply to make sure that their school receives all the government funding to which it is entitled - helping them provide your child with the best education and support.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 already receiving an Universal Infant Free School Meal arranged by their school will still have to apply to enable their school to get any extra funding.

If you do not have access to a computer or the internet, speak to your child's school.

Asthma Sufferers

If your child uses an inhaler at school can you please check that it is in date. If your child has recently been diagnosed with asthma please inform the school so we can update our asthma register.

Defibrillator



The school now has an AED. The teaching staff have received training should the device need to be used.


We have also registered the defibrillator with the ambulance service which means the device can be used by the community during term time whilst the school is open.

Healthy Eating



At the start of a new year it is often commonplace for people to be looking at eating more healthily, especially after the excesses of the Christmas festivities. School is no different and we have received lots of resources from The Change4Life Campaign about eating more healthily and being aware of the amount of sugar, salt and fat that we are consuming. I led an assembly this week and talked to the children about these issues and shared a video with them highlighting the fact that some foods contain hidden sugars. Your children should have brought home a little card envelope containing some information, stickers and quizzes relating to the Change4Life campaign. You can download an app that will allow you to scan barcodes to see how much sugar, salt and fat you are eating; all things you could do as a family. The school is also in the process of reviewing its Healthy Living and Learning award and we need to evaluate the work the school does to promote healthy eating.

As a result of The Change4Life Campaign and our work towards the GHLL award we have been looking at healthy eating across the school and as a result we would like to draw to your attention some new ideas and to remind you of a few existing policies regarding healthy eating.

Snack Time

As a school we like children to bring in mid-morning snacks and as we are trying to promote a healthy approach to eating we would appreciate it if snacks could be kept to FRUIT, CEREAL BARS or RAW VEGETABLES. We would like to restrict crisps and chocolate biscuits to packed lunches - **Please do not send your child with chocolate bars or bags of sweets.**

Packed Lunch

For those children bringing a packed lunch we ask parents to provide a balanced lunch that supports the values of eating healthily.

Birthday Cakes or Birthday Sweets

There have been a growing number of requests for children to bring in cakes and sweets to give to their friends on their birthday. We understand that this is a nice thing to do as a child but it obviously doesn't 'fit' with our push on healthy eating. Please do not send cakes or sweets in on your child's birthday. If your child would like to give something to the class an idea that has worked well in the past is a birthday book. This is when the family provides a book for the class that has a dedication written in by the family and is presented to the class on the child's birthday. There is no expectation for families to do this, it is merely a suggestion.

Homework Cakes

Those of you with children in KS2 will be aware of the 'Homework Cake' that has featured on the homework sheets for quite a while. Whilst it has been a pleasure to sample the delicious cakes that have been made the staff felt that this item has reached its sell by date and in order for the school to be promoting healthy eating we couldn't continue to endorse lots of cake making and eating! Therefore cake making for homework is off the menu.

Summary

These issues are often very emotive topics in schools. Therefore, rather than publish a list of forbidden and acceptable snacks I feel that parents should use their discretion and judgement in providing a snack for their child whilst supporting the overall aims of promoting healthy eating. Please be aware that teachers may talk to your child or yourself should their morning snacks or packed lunches be considered to be not supporting this healthy eating initiative and you may be asked to provide a healthier option.
