


As we head into the winter months it seems a timely opportunity to remind parents of the procedure for school closures should we need to shut the school.

STAY ALERT CONTROL THE VIRUS SAVE LIVES

What should I do if my child tests positive for COVID-19 over the Christmas Holiday?

- Child should self isolate for 10 ten days following positive result
- Close contacts should take daily LFD tests for 7 days
- If you get a positive LFD test, self isolate and book a PCR test

If your child tests positive for COVID and will be absent from school at the start of term, please text Mr Mitchell on this number 07434617493.

This will allow Mr Mitchell to plan for a safe return to school in January
