A word from the head......

The school is now back in full swing and it was great to see music lessons and clubs getting started this week. All clubs will be running next week. Apologies for any confusion this week with when clubs started. It has been a busy time in Reception and the children are settling really well. We are hoping that they will all be in full time from the start of October. The Year 6 pupils have completed their 'Bikeability' course this week and the sports coaches from District Sports and SuperStars have started working in the school as part of the schools development of PE as a result of the additional Sports Premium funding schools are receiving from September.

At last weeks 'Meet The Teacher' evening I spoke to parents about the progress that the school has made over the last three years. Topics covered at the meeting included:

- Summary of SATs and other assessments
- Celebration of rise in progress made from KS1 - KS2. This year 94% of pupils made two levels of progress in reading, writing and maths. This is above the National Median and is a huge improvement for the school.
- Celebration of the enrichment available to pupils at Glenfall
- Report on progress made since the last OFSTED inspection.
- Report on internal review of the schools improvement.
- Presentation of the schools revised vision statement (attached)

If you missed the meeting last week and would like to find out a bit more please let me know. If there are a number of parents wishing to hear more we can arrange for another opportunity for this to happen.

Parent Pay — School Lunches


