Without a doubt you will have contributed towards reducing the number of local infections - thank you!

Half Term COVID Reporting

In order for me to plan to make any further changes to our protective measures after half term (should I need to) I would appreciate it if you could **report any positive PCR results for your children by sending a text message to the school mobile number - 07434617493**. Thank you for your support with this as it will allow me to make an informed decision about any changes that may be required to ensure the safety of your children and the school staff. If I feel it necessary to reintroduce additional protective measures I will update you before we return to school on 1st November.

You will also have received another letter today which hopefully clarifies the procedures for testing and self isolation. The national messages seem to have become confused and many people are not sure of what is the right thing to do. My rule of thumb would be - if in doubt, self-isolate and get a PCR test.

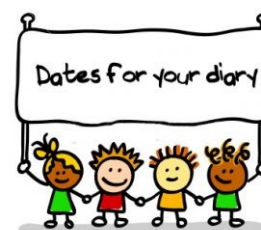

COVID-19 – Update

I'm sure that you will be aware that the number of positive COVID-19 cases are rising nationally but also locally. The rapidly rising infections in Gloucestershire have triggered thresholds for additional action and we have received some updated guidance.

I feel that the messages around testing and isolation have become confused and it is difficult to know what to do if we suspect that someone may have COVID-19.

I hope that the following information will hopefully clarify the situation, particularly with the updated guidance for LFD testing of children under 11.

Symptomatic?

New continuous cough – Fever 37.8 or over – Loss of smell or taste

As soon as anyone becomes symptomatic, they should isolate immediately and arrange to have a PCR test to see if they have COVID-19. If the result is negative, they can return to school as soon as they feel well. If the result is positive they should self-isolate for 10 days.

LFD Tests (Lateral Flow Tests)

Whilst routine LFD testing on children under 11 is not currently recommended nationally, we have received guidance from South West Public Health and South West Health Security Agency which suggests that parents may wish to test their children twice a week.

If you choose to use a LFD test on your child you must take the appropriate action and self-isolate and get a PCR test if it is positive.

If your child is displaying one of the three main symptoms, no matter how mild, do not use the LFD tests to diagnose COVID. You must self-isolate and book a PCR test.

If in doubt as to whether it is a COVID symptom, please self isolate book a PCR test.

We have also been advised to inform parents that non-symptomatic household contacts of a confirmed case should take daily LFD tests whilst they await their PCR results and continue to attend school until the result of the PCR test is known. This is at the parents discretion but is strongly recommended.

Close Contacts

All close contacts of confirmed cases are advised to take a PCR test. If close contacts are under 18 years 6 months, are fully vaccinated, have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial or not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons they do not need to self-isolate whilst they wait for their PCR result. They may however wish to do daily LFD tests.

Already had COVID-19?

If someone has recently (within 90 days) had a positive PCR test for COVID-19, they are likely to have developed some immunity. Individuals are exempt from testing by both PCR and LFD within 90 days of a positive PCR test, unless they develop new symptoms, in which case they should isolate and arrange for a PCR test.

What if my child starts to show symptoms at school?

If your child starts to show COVID symptoms at school, we will contact you and ask you to collect your child and to arrange for a PCR test. Your child must not return to school until you receive the result. We respectfully ask that you keep us up to date with the outcome of the test result.

If in doubt as to whether it is a COVID symptom, please self isolate book a PCR test.

Working together we can continue to protect our school community.
