I hope that you all had a good Easter Break. The weather was great and hopefully allowed you to get out and about. Many parents and children have started to use the field, adventure playground and trim trail after school. All pupils must be supervised by their own parent or by another adult who has been given that responsibility.




Netball Club

The results for the Netball League were released just before Easter. Glenfall came second in a pool of seven. The team did brilliantly well and was by far the best season ever. Well done netballers!


Dogs

The Music Junction



In September we are offering three year 5 children (current year 4) the chance to have mandolin lessons at a very reduced cost. The lessons will cost £20 a term and the children will have free use of a Music Junction mandolin for the year. You may also need to buy a violin book. The places are for children who are <u>not</u> currently learning an instrument in school.
