


Tokyo 2020 Stickers

flu: 5 reasons to vaccinate your child

- 1. Protect your child.** The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia
- 2. Protect you, your family and friends.** Vaccinating your child will help protect more vulnerable family and friends
- 3. No injection needed.** The nasal spray is painless and easy to have
- 4. It's better than having flu.** The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record
- 5. Avoid costs.** If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare

What should I do?
Contact your child's GP if your child was aged two or three years old (on the 31 August of the current flu season) and you haven't heard from them by early November.
If your child is at primary school, the school will send you a consent form. Please sign and return it. If your child has a health condition that puts them at greater risk from flu, they can get the flu vaccine from their GP.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Check to see if your child is eligible using the confidential online portal available on our website www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals

You can secure a tasty free meal for your child and save yourself up to £437 per year.

Plus your child's school receives extra funding for each eligible child registered.

Gloucestershire COUNTY COUNCIL

If you receive a qualifying benefit, your child's school is entitled to extra funding.

So even if you don't want your child to take a free meal, you should still apply to make sure that their school receives all the government funding to which it is entitled - helping them provide your child with the best education and support.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 already receiving an Universal Infant Free School Meal arranged by their school will still have to apply to enable their school to get any extra funding.

If you do not have access to a computer or the internet, speak to your child's school.

Y6 Secondary School Transfer

The deadline for making your choices for secondary school transfer is **31st October**. Please make your application online. If you have not received a letter please contact the school office.



Bikeability

Arrivals at school before 8:45

The start of the school day is 8:45. We have started to see an increasing number of children arriving much earlier than this. Whilst we do not want to discourage children's eagerness to get to school, we must ask that pupils do not arrive until 8:45. The children are not supervised until this time and as such we can not be responsible for them prior to this time and can not ensure their safety and welfare.




Disco

Eco Club need your help!


We are collecting two new items at school this year for recycling.
