

### SIMS Parent

Some parents will have received emails inviting them to register for this system. SIMS Parent is our preferred method of collecting and maintaining contact information for your child. Please register to use this service and check your information and submit.



Some parents will receive reminder emails as you haven't yet registered for the service. Please register when you receive your email and check, edit and submit as soon as you are able to.

Once you are registered we would suggest that you check your information regularly. If you change your address, phone number or email you can change this information yourself and submit to the school.



## Virtual Parents Meetings - 10th & 12th November 2020

This week you will have received an email and instructions about booking appointments for your child's parent meetings on the 10th and 12th of November. The booking window for making appointments opened this morning at 07:30 and will remain open until 6th November at 16:00. The information which I sent to you this week fully explains how to book an appointment and how to join the video meetings on the day of your appointment. I anticipate a few 'technical glitches' as we get to grips with the new system and ask for your patience as we try to resolve them. As previously requested we would be most grateful if, where possible, divorced or separated parents attend the meetings together. If this is not possible you will be able to book separate appointments.



### Rags - to - Riches

#### Clearing out your wardrobes over half term?

We will be having a **Rags-2-Riches clothing collection on 9th November**. This date will be the only day that you can drop bags off for collection. You will note that it is the same day as the T4U Shoebox Collection. This has been planned to coincide so that we can minimise the potential risk of additional items being brought into school. Your bags of rags can be dropped off at the front of the school when you arrive.



### Parking Problems

Please park responsibly and with consideration for our neighbours. I have had two reports this week from neighbours of the school saying that parents have blocked their driveways and that when asked to move, the parent was verbally abusive towards them. This is not acceptable behaviour and the school will report any further incidents of this nature directly to the police.

In addition to these incidents I have seen a car, on several occasions, parked right on the corner of Briarbank Rise. This is extremely dangerous and could endanger a child's life. I have contacted the PCSO for Charlton Kings and have asked them to monitor the situation.

## FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Check to see if your child is eligible using the confidential online portal available on our website [www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals](http://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals)

You can secure a tasty free meal for your child and save yourself up to £437 per year.

Plus your child's school receives extra funding for each eligible child registered.

If you receive a qualifying benefit, your child's school is entitled to extra funding.

So even if you don't want your child to take a free meal, you should still apply to make sure that their school receives all the government funding to which it is entitled - helping them provide your child with the best education and support.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 already receiving an Universal Infant Free School Meal arranged by their school will still have to apply to enable their school to get any extra funding.

If you do not have access to a computer or the internet, speak to your child's school.

## flu: 5 reasons to vaccinate your child

- 1. Protect your child.** The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia.
- 2. Protect you, your family and friends.** Vaccinating your child will help protect more vulnerable family and friends.
- 3. No injection needed.** The nasal spray is painless and easy to have.
- 4. It's better than having flu.** The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record.
- 5. Avoid costs.** If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare.

**What should I do?**

Contact your child's GP if your child was aged two or three years old (on the 31 August of the current flu season) and you haven't heard from them by early November.

If your child is at primary school, the school will send you a consent form. Please sign and return it. If your child has a health condition that puts them at greater risk from flu, they can get the flu vaccine from their GP.




# STAY ALERT ▶ CONTROL THE VIRUS ▶ SAVE LIVES

**What should I do if my child tests positive for COVID-19 over a weekend or during a holiday?**

You **must** contact Mr Mitchell on this number **07434617493** to inform him of the situation. Please leave a voice mail or text message if the phone isn't answered.

This is so that information regarding possible contacts can be passed to PHE Track & Trace.



### COVID-19 Symptoms

Everyone has a role to play in keeping our school safe and helping to stop the spread of COVID-19. You should book a COVID-19 test if your child has:

- A high temperature...** This means they have a temperature over 37.8°C.
- A new continuous cough...** This means coughing for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24hrs (if they usually have a cough it may be worse than usual)
- A loss or change to their sense of smell or taste...** This means they have noticed they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

OR

If your child has any of the above symptoms they must remain at home until they have received a negative test result. All household members should also remain at home. You can book a test online at [www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test](http://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test) or by calling 119

If your child does not have symptoms of COVID-19 but has other cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat (without a fever), mild colds etc, they do not need to be tested and they or members of your household do not need to self-isolate. Your child can attend school if they are fit to do so. Please refrain from 'dosing' up with Calpol as it makes it difficult for us to identify if they have a temperature.
