


A word from the head......

I hope that you found this weeks parents meetings useful and that you managed to get a bit of an insight into how your children are getting on at school. Y5 & 6 had the amazing opportunity to observe a heart dissection carried out by Mr Butler from Balcarras School. This was a fantastic experience and the children got so much from the session. Most of the children found it fascinating and many were brave enough to handle the hearts and look closely at the structures inside.







Keeping on the theme of hearts, we marked the Heart Foundation's Restart-a-Heart Day by educating both parents and pupils on how to carry out heart compressions in case of cardiac arrest. Alan from Zone Safety Training came into the school to work with the children and also to give the parents an opportunity to administer chest compressions to a resuscitation dummy. There was also time to find out how to use a defibrillator.

Phil's Memory Marathon

Sooo...I have some news! My good friend and colleague Cat Whyte and I have been offered places in the 2024 London Marathon, to raise money for the Stroke Association in Philip Woodman 's name.

In 2019, my husband Phil suffered a catastrophic stroke following heart surgery. This devastated his life and that of those who loved him, leaving him unable to speak and partially paralysed. He spent 5 months in hospital and in time and with a lot of hard work, he learned to walk again and managed to regain some of his speech. Phil was unable to work or drive although he was desperate to do both, and this motivated him to work hard at his recovery. We knew he would never be back to where he was before the stroke but for over 3 years he pushed himself to keep getting better. It was a challenging time for us all but we were all incredibly proud of Phil and the support of those around him helped to push him further, and he made a much better recovery than anyone had predicted given the amount of damage caused to his brain.

Then in January 2023 he became ill. It transpired he had suffered another stroke - a spontaneous bleed this time damaging much of the healthy brain tissue he had left. And this time there was no chance of recovery and Phil died just 3 weeks after his 51st birthday.

His death was a tragedy. He leaves behind 3 children, a grandson, parents, sisters, in laws, nephews, nieces, cousins, aunties and uncles and countless friends who have all been devastated by his passing. And I have lost my husband, becoming widowed at just 37 years old.

I am honoured to be running the marathon in Phil's name. I am not a runner, and neither is Cat! But we're going to give it a good go! We massively appreciate the support shown by everyone we have told so far and hope to raise lots of money for a cause so close to my heart.







Student wellbeing is central to the ethos of our school. We are therefore delighted to share with you a new NHS Gloucestershire funded service designed to support young people aged 7-12 (years 3-7) who are experiencing fears or worries; Lumi Nova.

What is Lumi Nova?

<u>Lumi Nova: Tales of courage is</u> an intergalactic adventure game where players step into the shoes of a newly recruited Luminaut and start an exciting adventure through space - travelling to different planets, meeting new characters, solving puzzles and attempting challenges. Lumi Nova support young people to fight fears & manage worries. Whilst exploring planets, customising characters and earning treasure your child breaks their fears and worries down into manageable steps, learning life-long skills and building resilience.

Lumi Nova is designed for 7 - 12 year olds (school years 3 - 7) who are having difficulties with fears and worries related to social situations, separation or phobias, but may also be helpful for young people outside this age range.

Designed by BFB Labs, Lumi Nova was developed with NHS clinicians and leading academics. It is based upon Cognitive Behavioural Therapy and Exposure Therapy which are proven to be effective. Lumi Nova is recommended by NICE (National Institute for Health & Care Excellence) and adheres to strict standards of clinical safety.

How to Access Lumi Nova:

To use Lumi Nova you must first register to get a game key by visiting luminova.app/glos and completing a short registration form. You will then receive an SMS message that will guide you through getting started.

You will be directed to download Lumi Nova. Lumi Nova is free to download from the Apple and Google Play Stores and is compatible with iPhones, iPads and most Android smartphones and tablets.
