

Transport

Maths:

The children will focus on numbers 11 to 17. They will practise partitioning each number in different ways and finding all related addition and subtraction facts. Through practical activities and written number sentences, we will build fluency, confidence and a strong understanding of number bonds.

Science:

We will learn about the human body and the season of spring. Children will name body parts (inside and outside), describe their jobs and explore the five senses through practical activities and a nature walk. We will also identify signs of spring and describe typical spring weather.

RE:

We will explore the big question: What is it like to be brought up in a Hindu home in the UK today? Children will learn about Hindu beliefs, daily life, celebrations and traditions, and consider how faith can influence family life and values.

Computing:

The children will be continuing to learn about technology around us. The children will develop their mouse control and keyboard skills, practise typing and learn how to log in independently.

PE:

We will explore basic shapes, balances, travelling movements, rolls and jumps, focusing on control, strength and safe landings. As their confidence grows, they will begin linking movements together to create simple sequences with a clear beginning, middle and end. Towards the end of the unit, children will apply their skills on low apparatus, performing safely and with control.

Literacy:

We will explore *The Boy Who Sailed the World*, *Whatever Next*, and *Mrs Armitage on Wheels*. Children will create their own adventure stories while learning about syllables, exclamation marks, prefixes and setting descriptions. We will also continue to practise the key components of a sentence to strengthen our writing skills.

Geography:

We will explore our local area of Charlton Kings using maps, aerial photographs and digital tools. Children will identify key human and physical features, describe what our area is like and sketch local landmarks. We will also find out how we travel to school and create simple maps of our own journeys.

Art/ DT:

The children will take part in a range of creative seasonal art projects, exploring colour, pattern and different crafting techniques. They will also design and build their own race car models.

PSHE:

This half term in PSHE, we will learn about feelings and relationships. Children will recognise and name different emotions, explore what makes a positive friendship and understand who they can talk to if they feel worried or lonely.
